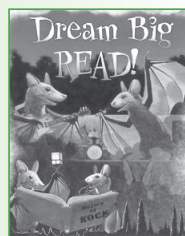

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

The services and staff at Sayville Library are continually changing and adjusting to meet the evolving needs of the community. Since moving to the Greene Avenue facility almost three (3) years ago, we have welcomed 4,358 new library card holders, bringing the number of residents with cards to 79% of the Sayville/West Sayville population. The library has become the meeting place for more than 500 sessions of scout troops, clubs and local organizations, filling a need in the community for a public gathering place. You may have been one of our patrons who enjoyed a concert at the library, participated in a craft workshop or attended any of the over 800 library programs held here last year.

The Proposed 2012-2013 Budget presented for voter approval this year is in line with the New York State Governor's tax cap requirements. Although Sayville Library is considered a "school district library" with taxes collected by the District, the Library is required to follow the guidelines for a Special Taxing District. The final allowable amount for the 2012-2013 tax appropriation was arrived at using the NYS Controller's calculator, which factors in a number of controls that resulted in an allowed budget increase of 2.28%. There will be no increase in the bond payments on the new library facility as \$98,438 from unexpended bond funds will be applied to the 2012-2013 debt service, keeping the payment unchanged from last year. The Library applied for and received various state grants during construction, the proceeds of which were added to the bond funds. The bond repayment varies over 20 years with the majority of the years flat or decreasing. Although 2012-2013 is one of the few years that sees a significant increase, we are thankful that we can hold this budget line flat.

When you go to the polls you will be voting on an estimated increase of \$0.84 a month, \$10.10 annually for a residence assessed at \$40,000. Please note that included in the Sayville Library District line on your tax bill is the Sayville Historical Society's tax appropriation.

While the taxing entities were restricted to an approximate 2% budget increase, this

does not mean that your library taxes will only increase by that amount. Once the assessed valuation is set by Islip Town in the summer of 2012, the actual tax rates will be calculated, but that is after the May vote. You will be electing two Trustees this year, one for a term of five-years and the other for four-years to fill a vacated seat.

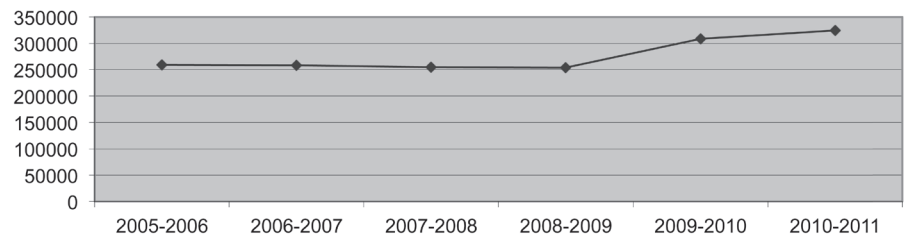

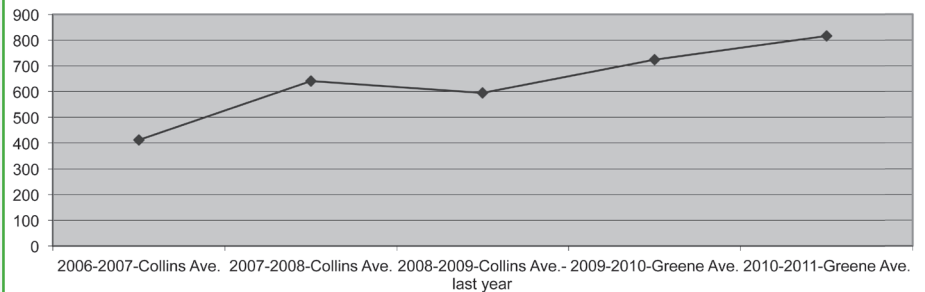

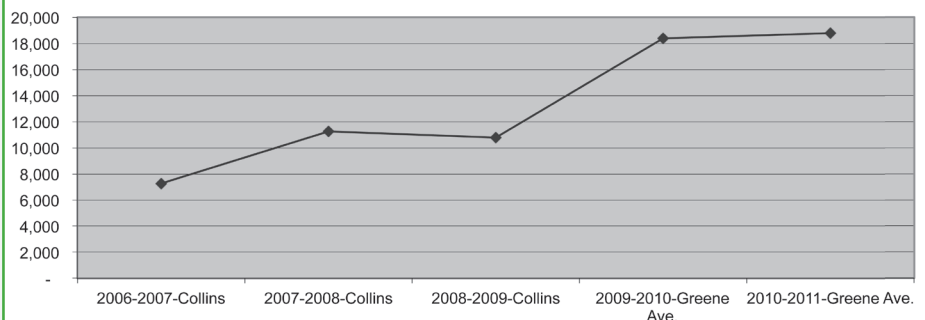
Six Years of Material Circulation Statistics
